## Chaplain's Message: Fr. Marcel E. Okwara, CSsR



### Brothers in Christ,

Before we continue our reflection on The Spirituality of Aging or Later Years, I want each of you to know that I am praying for you and asking the good Lord to keep you safe, to strengthen your immune system to be able to resist COVID-19, and to help you see how you can serve him and our needy brothers and sisters even as we continue to stay home. Please stay safe. And remember this— God knows what we are going through! In the first edition, I discussed the spirituality of later years and its meanings. In the following edition, I stressed the importance of using later years to acknowledge the wrongs we have done and to seek for forgiveness from God. This edition is about hospitality and fidelity.

Littered everywhere in the Gospels is the story of a welcoming Messiah. Jesus was all things to all people. He was very welcoming. He welcomed both saints and sinners. He welcomed children, lepers, tax collectors, prostitutes etc. He fed the hungry spiritually and materially. In the Gospel of Matthew 25:31-46, he tells us that his criteria for entering the Kingdom of God is hospitality. And Jesus himself experienced hospitality on earth. Mary, Martha, and Lazarus welcomed him at their home and attended to his needs. Now, in your later years, I invite you to consider another kind of hospitality— that is, hospitality for God. Make a daily intentional effort to welcome Jesus to be home with you. Create a sacred place and time for God. Can you allow him to occupy the room of your heart? Hospitality to God

first, deepens our hospitality to neighbor and gives it meaning and purpose. Hospitality to God makes our hospitality to the needy a charity and not a philanthropy. And what is charity? It is friendship with God and with the people of God for the sake of God.

During this time of heightened fear, anxiety and social distancing necessitated by the novel coronavirus, strive to welcome the Lord in your life in a way you have never done before. Later years is a time to come home and be with God. It is a time to be more available to God. It is a time to be hospitable to God. It is a time to invite God to be with you in a profound way. If we are not comfortable being with God and enjoy being in his presence here on earth, how can we possibly do otherwise in heaven?

Another important virtue to cultivate during later years is fidelity. Later years should be spent re-committing to God. So, set aside past unfaithfulness to God and to re-commit to love God. Say YES to God again. Although you are going to be saved by God's fidelity and not yours, but then, saying YES to God is vital. Later years is a time of finding God even in all our difficulties, being faithful to God in prayer and in all other things. However, fidelity is not rigidity. Fidelity is faithfulness. Be faithful in welcoming God daily in your life and family. Be faithful in committing and re-committing your life to God. Be faithful in your prayer life. Never let a day expire without spending some time in prayer. And before you shut your eyes to sleep at night, pray like Jesus and say, "Lord, into your hands, I commend my spirit, soul and body." ... **to be continued!**

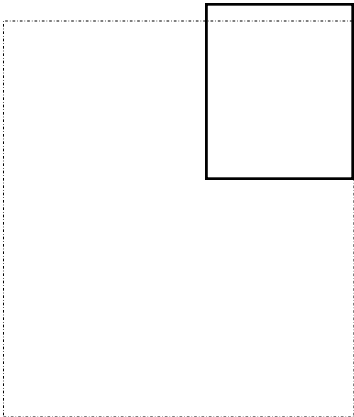
