Greetings and Peace to my Brother Knights and your families, and a blessed December you, as we begin our holiday season: with Thanksgiving Day for all families, and Black Friday, for all of you serious shoppers.


One of my favorite hospital memories is the story of a woman who had cancer. She was the mother of ten children, and she told me that her greatest pain was not from the cancer, but from seven of her children who had stopped going to church. "I taught them better, Father, and I feel partially responsible," she would say. I could only listen, and assure her of my prayers for her and the children. The week before she died, some wonderful things began to happen. On Monday, her oldest son asked if I would hear his confession. So, we went down to the chapel, and celebrated the sacrament. Within the next three days, seven of her children went to confession. Intrigued and deeply touched by this, I asked the oldest child about these confessions. "Well Father," she said, "we're the seven children who don't go to church, and we know our mother is suffering because of cancer and us. So, we decided to make good confessions, and return to Sunday Mass, as a gift to our mother and ourselves. She doesn't ask for much, and we know what this means to her."

Their mother did pass away; but to the best of my knowledge, these children are now active members of their parishes. My Brother Knights, the point is that we never know the impact our sacrifices and struggles can have on our families, friends, and the church. Once again, we trust that God will use us for the building of His Kingdom. This also makes us aware, as we draw closer to Thanksgiving and Christmas, of our present sacrifices, for Lent is not the only season of sacrifice. What do we continue to offer to God, that will help our families and the world?

Last week, when I visited two people in the hospital, one told me that she was offering her suffering for her sick grandson. Another told me that she was offering her illness for the successful passage of the Marriage Amendment. What will our offering be today, and who will that offering benefit? Let this be our meditation for November, as we thank God for His many blessings, and His Presence in our struggles. God bless you, my brothers, and have a Happy November. Please pray for our Knights and family members who are sick or in distress, and pray for our country during these election days, that we will make good voting decisions, based on our prayers and our conscience. I look forward to seeing you soon. God's blessings and peace to you all.
