

Greetings to my Brother Knights and your families. For each of you, I pray that this New Year will be filled with the hope and promise of knowing that our God walks with us always. I now share part of my vocation story, because I hope that, in these words, you will be inspired to continue to discern God's plan for your life each day.

The question I most often asked myself was: "Surely, Lord, you must be talking to someone else!" After all, I wanted to get married, raise a family, and become either a first baseman, police officer, or a disc jockey. Through school, work, different relationships, and lots of prayer, the desire to serve God always seemed to be my point of return. Eventually, I found myself reading the life of Saint Francis, and feeling connected to his life and journey. Like me, God had brought Francis through physical illness, personal disappointments, and later confession.

Within himself, Francis saw a desire to not only serve the Church, but to live a special way of life.
